It is worth note that while this prayer speaks of the historical event of the Resurrection, actually refers to the present and the future.

There is a deliberate ambiguity in the Latin text which is translated well in our prayer that we may "rise up in the light of life".

This can be understood as a prayer for the future that finally we may share in Christ's Resurrection.

O God, who on this day, through your only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked the path to eternity, grant,

we pray, that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

However, it can also be understood as a prayer for the present, that renewed by the Holy Spirit, we may rise up today "in the light of life".

With the Easter Candle in the sanctuary, we have a clear visual link to the symbolism of the light of life.

This is a reference to Psalm 35/36:10; "In you is the source of life, and in your light we see light." This speaks of our present life — our life today.

Scripture Readings 21st April 2019, Easter Sunday Year C

Luke's Book of Acts describes how after his death Jesus continues his work on earth through his Holy Spirit, who interrupts Peter's speech to Cornelius. Peter then realises that forgiveness of sins is offered to "everyone who believes" in Jesus' name.

The dramatic psalm thanks and praises the Lord for rescuing us from the dangers threatening us. It includes the shouts that welcomed Jesus into the Temple on Palm Sunday, now the second verse of the "Holy, Holy, Holy".

Our second readings are all from Paul's letters. The vigil reading from Romans compares baptism to death: our sinful life has died: we have risen to a new life in Christ. The Sunday reading from Colossians draws attention away from earthly marks of religion: our focus should be on our new life in Christ. The alternative Second Isaiah describes the new Exodus, the return from exile in

reading is an early Easter homily. In the Jewish calendar Passover was followed by the feast of Unleavened Bread.

In the three synoptic gospels three women discover the tomb empty and run to tell the apostles, who disbelieve. But in John's gospel Mary of Magdala, alone, finds the stone removed from the tomb. Without going inside she runs to tell Peter. Peter goes in first and sees the empty burial cloths. When the other disciple goes in, he believes.

Psalm Response (Sunday): This day was made by the Lord: we rejoice and are glad.

News from the Hope Centre

Over 15,000 people signed the petition that the landlord should have a change of heart, and they did! The Hope Centre has agreed to vacate Oasis House but on the basis that they will only move when a suitable building of appropriate size and location is available, and that prior to that, funding to cover the cost of any conversion or building work is in place.

Hope CEO Robin Burgess said: "We were delighted with the outcome of the campaign. When threatened with eviction, we hoped our supporters would rally around us and that's exactly what they did – in their thousands."

- Meat tins/Fish tins/Veg tins/Potato tins
- Custard tins
- Pasta sauce jars/Dried rice
- Cereal and tea bags

There is an ancient tradition that after his Resurrection, Jesus first appeared to his mother to console her in herb grief and to assure her of the fulfilment of God's promise.

The assurance was later given to Mary of Magdala who was told to give the Good News to the apostles (*John 20:17*), and then to the apostles directly (*John 20:19-25*). Then the apostles were told to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptising then in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (*Matthew 28:19*). Ths is the commission of the Church; our commission.
