First Holy Communion Preparation

It's that time of the year again when we are enrolling children who want to be prepared for their First Holy Communion.

The Catholic Church is very aware that many children who prepare for the their First Holy Communion, and come to Mass faithfully during their time of preparation, very quickly seem to give up after the celebration. We are also aware that less than half of those who are prepared for First Holy Communion then go on to seek Confirmation. In fact, only about half of those who are Baptised them go on to prepare for Holy Communion.

In this, the Church cannot attach any blame to the children, and herself needs to recognise her responsibility for this.

An important and significant book was written a few years ago, entitled "Evangelising the Baptised" by Fr Jonathan Cotton. It begins with a quotation from Cardinal Turkson, Archbishop of Cape Coast, Ghana:

"In my humble opinion, the same caution that I express for Africa I see in Europe. Christianity in Europe started on an evangelistic base then developed a catechetics base. And it never found its way back be being evangelical. The early years of the Church were all based on evangelisation. When the structures began to evolve and develop it became catechetical, notional — you teach people certain things, they can repeat them, than you baptise them. The emphasis on the thrust of evangelisation — provoking conversation in people — and helping people find a real relationship with a personal God — that gradually was missed out."

Interview with 'The Tablet', 10th November 2007

Catechetics = the process of teaching about Jesus and the Faith. Evangelistic = bringing people into a relationship with Jesus This is the situation we have inherited, and for many years, the Church sought to remedy the situation with what we hoped would be better catechetics; hardly a year has passed since the late 1960s that a new course has been published, but this has made no perceptible difference. Fr James Mallon has described this as doing what we know doesn't work with increased enthusiasm.

We recognise that what is lacking is evangelisation: fundamentally what Cardinal Turkson calls "a real relationship with a personal God".

However, it is not enough just to help the children to have this relationship. Jesus told us to "make disciples of *all* people" (*Matthew 28:19*), not just children.

The emphasis of the Church in our present age must be evangelisation. Our Alpha programme is one part of this, but it is increasingly the emphasis of our First Holy Communion course.

Evangelisation must be aimed at people of every age — children, parents, grandparents, uncles and aunts, brothers and sisters — in short, *everyone*.

Today we are asking parents to enrol their children in our First Holy Communion programme. In doing so, parents need to recognise their own responsibility, but above all, what matters is their own "real relationship with a personal God", and through the coming months we will be seeking to help parents and carers to develop their own relationship with God our Father, through Jesus Christ who was born, lived, taught and died for us, and having conquered death, rose again and remains alive and with us in the Blessed Sacrament, in the words of Holy Scripture and in one another, in the power of the Holy Spirit who continues to inspire and empower us.

Scripture Readings 23rd September 2018, 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

Wisdom was the last book of the Old Testament to be written, probably in Alexandria about 50 BC. Written in Greek, it is not in the Hebrew Scriptures and is therefore treated as apocryphal in non-Catholic bibles. The wicked are blinded by their thoughts: "haphazard were we born", they thought, and we leave no trace when we die, "because no one returns." So "let us enjoy the good things that exist" and "oppress the righteous", simply because "he annoys us". But Wisdom responds: "God formed man to be imperishable; in the image of his own nature".

The psalm implores God's help against our enemies, confident that he will help.

James' letter continues emphasising we must show our faith in good works, for which we need "wisdom from above". We must

"show works in the meekness of wisdom", not in "jealousy and selfish ambition". "Friendship with the world is enmity with God".

In the Gospel Jesus uses a quiet moment on the way back from the Transfiguration to tell his disciples again that he will be killed and "after three days he will rise", but as yet they cannot understand. He then insists that his way is to "be last of all and servant of all", giving welcome to the least significant, even little children. God's wisdom is not the world's wisdom.
