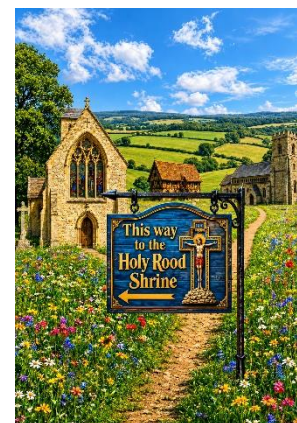
AD 2026:

The 470th year of the closing of the original parish of St Gregory.

The Church of St Gregory the Pope stood on the corner of modern-day Gregory Street and Freeschool Street, NN1 1ST.

The Church was home to **The Guild of the Holy Rood in the Wall** whose primary role was to pray for the living and all the departed. The Guild was dissolved early in the reign of Edward VI and the Rood was "doubtless destroyed".

The School, when pulled down in 1840, revealed a Norman arcade, and other parts of the now **former Church**, to still be intact.
