Our Easter Candle

The Budded Cross is a Christian cross with three circular lobes at each end of its arms, creating a trefoil shape. The budded Cross is also known as the trefoil, botonee, or cathedral cross.

The three lobes/buds on each end of the Cross symbolise the Holy Trinity, The Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and they represent new growth and the renewal of life. Another meaning is the twelve buds represent the twelve apostles.

For many Christians, the budded Cross serves as a reminder of the fundamental belief in the Trinity, the interconnectedness of all life, and a symbol of hope and renewal.

At the back of the Pascal Candle is a simplified representation of The Trinity. Inspiration was taken from a fresco called The Trinity in the church of Santa Maria Novella in Rome. It was painted in 1425 by the Florentine painter Masaccio (Tomasso de Giovanni di Simone Guidi, 1401-28) the founder of Renaissance art. It shows God the Father standing behind and above His crucified Son. He is supporting the crossbar of the crucifix thus echoing His Son's sacrifice. Between both their heads hovers The Holy Spirit.

The doctrine of the Trinity - The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit - God as three separate beings yet remaining one entity is represented by Masaccio depicting all Three as one shape. The Trinity is first mentioned in Matthew's Gospel (28:v19) as comprising Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

We pray to The Father, to The Son and to The Holy Spirit- the Trinity who hear our prayers thus renewing and strengthening our lives through faith and love.

The other images are to remind us of God's material generosity through the parable of the Loaves and Fishes and the parable of forgiveness given to the Prodigal Son by the love his father has for him no matter what he had done. Then at the very bottom of the candle is the image of praying hands to remind us that all the Trinity hears our prayers and supplication. Especially we pray to God The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit in this Year of Prayer as requested by Pope Francis.

Wishing a happy and blessed Easter to you all

Happiness and blessedness are the same thing, if we accept the Jerusalem Bible translation of the Beatitudes, but later this year we will be using the English Standard Version of the Bible for our Mass readings, and we revert to the older word: 'blessed'. In modern usage, happiness is something transient, and something we can

generate from ourselves. Blessedness is different from that; it is a gift from God. Blessedness can (and normally does) bring happiness, but it is not self-generated. The blessedness of Easter is God's gift to us in the Resurrection of Our Lord from the tomb. Death has been defeated, and the victory over sin is accomplished.

Sunday 31st March: Easter Sunday, Year B

In a vision in Acts Peter is told that all animals and birds are suitable for eating: the restrictions of the Jewish Law are ending. So he can enter the house of Cornelius, a Gentile. Peter's speech is interrupted by the Holy Spirit welcoming the Gentile community into the church. Peter realises that forgiveness of sins is offered to "everyone who believes" in Jesus' name.

The vigil reading from Paul sees our baptism as joining Christ in his tomb, to rise to a new life in Christ, freed from the slavery of sin.

The dramatic Passover Psalm thanks God for repeatedly coming to our rescue and saving us.

Paul's letter to the Colossians draws attention away from earthly marks of religion: having died to things on earth, they should focus on the life to come when they "will appear with Christ in glory".

The alternative reading refers to the feast of Unleavened Bread, which followed Passover..

In the three synoptic gospels three women discover the tomb empty and run to tell the apostles. But in John's gospel Mary of Magdala is alone. Finding the stone removed from the tomb, she runs to tell Peter. Peter goes in first and sees the empty burial cloths. When the other disciple goes in, he believes.

Psalm Response:

This day was made by the Lord: we rejoice and are glad.

(Vigil/Day Acts 10:34,37-43 Psalm 117(118) Romans 6:3-11/Colossians 3:1-4/1 Corinthians 5:6-8 Matthew 28:1-10/John 20:1-9)

Stay Curious

There is a new strapline used by Alpha, which is "Stay Curious".

We are curious creatures — it is our nature to want to discover about ourselves, our environment, nature, our family roots and so many other things. Most children go through a phase where every sentence begins with the word 'why' and a time then they cannot keep their hands off things.

It is a sad reality that for some people their natural (and therefore God-given) curiosity diminishes or even dies; for some it is knocked out of them, for others a dreariness of life swamps them.

The true scientist is always seeking for knowledge; that is what science is. It is therefore a strange irony that one of the pieces of 'fake news' that is put about by some is that science has disproved

religion. Science is always seeking new knowledge and new understanding, and the most important questions, such as 'the meaning of life, the universe and everything'.

Alpha provides an environment in which people can explore faith, and the important understanding is that we all start from where we are, not from any preconception of where we ought to be. However, it is also not an 'echo chamber' where people only hear what they already think.

There are many who did not have the experience of being brought up in a Catholic home, or even in an overtly Christian home, and may have a very distorted idea of what the Catholic Church actually believes and does.

Alpha is not just for those who are beginning their exploration of curiosity about faith, the meaning of life and everything. That curiosity remains part of our God-given nature, and we can always go deeper into our faith. Many who have been practicing Catholics for many years have found that the experience of Alpha has deepened their faith and understanding of God.

Thursday Holy Hour & Adoration: There will be 40 hours of continuous adoration from 7.00 am on Friday 19th July until 11.00 pm on Saturday 20th July. This is part of the Year of Prayer leading up to the Jubilee year in 2025. Holy Hour remains as Holy Two Hours, from 9am until 11am. It is important that at least two people are present throughout the time of adoration. During cold weather, Adoration will be in the Hall.
