A phoenix from the ashes!

St Clement of Rome used, in his First Epistle to the Corinthians, the symbol of the phoenix bird rising from its ashes as an illustration of Christ's bodily Resurrection from the dead. We too shall share in Jesus' defeat of sin and death by virtue of our own Baptism and through a life that is orientated only toward Him. St Clement also wrote that as death approached the phoenix made a nest composed of spices, especially frankincense and myrrh; we can use this image to recall how the same frankincense and myrrh were brought by the Magi and St Mary Magdalene to Jesus to prefigure His death. Let us be confident then that the fire damaged areas of St Gregory's Church will rise from the ashes and be even more glorious than it was before!

Sunday Mass will be offered at 9.00am & 11.00am in St Gregory's School, Grange Road. NN3 2AX




The Holy Bible contains over 500 references to fire.

I know that I am not alone in thinking that we live in strange times as, once again, we find ourselves unable to gather for Mass in St Gregory's Church nor use the hall for refreshments, etc. Yet, amidst this wilderness experience we continue to receive an outpouring of love and support from both within and beyond our parish. You might like to be aware of the following:

- The diocesan Property Department are offering us invaluable support as we move forward.
- A second 'fire investigation' has taken place and the results will be shared first with our insurances.
- Quotes are being sought from several professional clean-up companies to deal with the affected areas.
- Electricity has been restored in a limited capacity whereas the gas and water remain disconnected.
- A gas safety certificate for the Presbytery has been issued and an electricity inspection is to be carried out; several other H&S works are ongoing.
- We pray that Mass will be celebrated in the Church

Some Joyful News: Whilst our focus is ensuring that we can return to St Gregory's Church as soon as possible, two smaller projects remain underway! These are covering the sanctuary 'platform' and ambo in new carpet called: "Gilden Chalice" and the creation of a tabernacle veil, ambo fall and lectern falls in "All Seasons fabric":



"The birds have a symbolic significance; they are the mediators between Heaven and Earth and in

early Christian art they signified saved souls. The elegantly decorated urn, a container for oils and perfumes, signifies Mary Magdalene, one of the most popular of Christian saints and consequently much depicted in Christian art. Amongst the many flowers in the design, it is possible to distinguish the Blue Iris, a floral symbol of the Virgin Mary and the Thistle, a symbol

of the Passion of Jesus Christ and the sufferings of the Christian martyrs. Finally, the grapevine symbolises abundant life and the grapes, the Eucharist."

I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do,

And, striking their breast, they say: through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. **Amen.**

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

At the words that follow, up to and including the Virgin Mary, all bow.

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. After each intention that is vocalised by the Deacon there is a short pause while the faithful pray. Therefore, the Deacon leads us in the Intercessions, but we do the praying, hence why it is also called "The Prayer of the Faithful". Lord, in your mercy.

For Catholics, the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life. It is the vital centre of all that the Church is and does, because at its heart is the real presence of the crucified, risen and glorified Lord, continuing and making available his saving work among us. Holy Communion is the literal Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

After the Preface, the people sing:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

BREAKING OF THE BREAD
