Universalis: The Lateran Basilica was built by the Emperor Constantine on the Lateran Hill in Rome in about AD 324. The feast of its dedication has been celebrated in Rome on this date since the twelfth century. In honour of the basilica, 'The mother and head of all the churches of the City and the World,' the feast has been extended

to the whole Roman Rite as a sign of unity and love towards the See of Peter, which, as St Ignatius of Antioch said in the second century, "presides over the whole assembly of charity". The Basilica is dedicated to St John the Baptist and St John the Evangelist.



Francis: It is important that every diocese in the world commemorate its own local **Saints, Blesseds, Venerables and Servants of God** on a single date. Therefore, from the Jubilee Year of AD 2025 please remember and honour, for example in the homily or at some other point, these figures of holiness, on 9th

Registration will be on Sunday 19th October after the 11am
Mass. If you know that you cannot come on that date, there is an alternative after the 10.30 Mass at Sacred Heart, Weston Favell on Sunday 12th October. Whichever day you register, it is for the same course, and makes no difference to where First Holy Communion is received.

<u>Supporting Your Parish:</u> Much the easiest way to support the parish financially is through a standing order directly from your own bank account. The information required for this is as follows:

Account Name; Northampton Roman Catholic Diocesan Trust Payment Ref; Parish Name/Area: (St. Gregory's, Northampton) Please remember that if you pay income tax, the Church can reclaim this on your giving, (£2.50 for every £10 given) and this is much simpler if you give by standing order.

<u>Parking</u>: Our car-park is small, & many have to park on the road. We are in a residential district, & our neighbours also like to park. Please be considerate, & remember that there are laws regarding where you may park. It is illegal to block a drive to a house where there is a dropped kerb or where a white line is painted indicating the needs of a disabled driver. It is also illegal to park at a road junction. There is usually space on Wellingborough Road at the side of Abington Park opposite the bottom of Lime Avenue.



NOVEMBER: MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

November is the time when we specifically pray for our departed loved ones and for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory as we aid them in their journey to be with God. If you write the names of your deceased loved ones on a piece of paper, and then place this list in the remembrance box, the Sacrifice of the Mass will be offered for them daily during November and prayers asked for them at the Sunday Mass.

opportunity to leave a single flower in the name of your departed loved ones who you are remembering at this Mass. Please bring the name you would like to be read out clearly written on a slip of paper and hand this to the people who will be at the doors. If you are remembering more than one person, please group in family names.

Holy Souls Rosary: Do join us for this each Thursday of November at 6:30pm as we pray for these intentions:

- 1. All the bereaved.
- 2. All the recently departed.
- 3. Our own departed loved ones.
- 4. All The Holy Souls in Purgatory.
- 5. The Basilica of Our Lady of Walsingham and The Confraternity of the Holy House, Corby.

We will begin the Holy Souls Rosary with the prayer to Our Lady of Walsingham. NB: Twenty-five specially commissioned Holy Souls single-decade rosary beads will be available for people to borrow for this devotion (and then to return to us for use the following week). The Holy Souls Rosary will be led by **Janet Northing**, who is the Co-Founder of the Confraternity of the Holy House, Corby, and its current Lay Guardian.

Sacrament of Confession: This act of the Lord's great mercy can be celebrated after the 9:00am Mass every Saturday using the 'Confessional Box' in the Church. Individuals can also request this sacrament at any time by speaking to Canon Bennie or Fr Wayne.



The Prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel is used in many parishes as part of the Rosary and/or after Holy Mass. In the autumn of 2018 Pope Francis asked that this prayer be regularly recited by the faithful in the wake of increasing Catholic disunity and revelations of sexual abuse by the clergy.

The Bill is currently awaiting its committee stage, at which amendments will be debated. The Government anticipates there will be twelve days of Committee stage, with the abortion clause listed for the last day of debate; this is currently expected to be Thursday, 22nd January AD 2026.
